Ministry Stats: January – September



Through September we have seen 5,015 different women in our centers. Often they had multiple visits and our total number of free services was 14,811. These services include pregnancy tests, peer counseling, helpline calls, maternity support services, post-abortion counseling and more than 200 ultrasound exams. 198 women that told us they were strongly considering an abortion, decided to give their child life. Also through September, 230 men and women chose to respond to our counseling by giving their lives to Christ.



"Outside of my family, nothing is more important to me than the sanctity of human life. Every year that I have been in Washington, on the 22nd of January you would have found me at the March for Life."

That was a quote from Lieutenant Colonel Oliver North when we asked him why he agreed to speak at our Celebration of Life banquet on **Thursday April 23rd, 2015** at the JW Marriott downtown.

Oliver L. North was born in San Antonio, Texas, graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis,

Maryland, and served 22 years as a Marine officer. His awards for service in combat include the Silver Star, the Bronze Star for valor and two Purple Hearts for wounds in action.

Not only is North a combat-decorated Marine, he is also a #1 NYT best-selling author, a small business founder, an inventor with multiple U.S. patents, a columnist, and the host of War Stories on the Fox News Channel. Yet, he claims his most important accomplishment is to be the husband of one, the father of four and the grandfather of thirteen.

Importantly, Oliver North is a Christian that is passionate about the issue of life and has an inspiring message to bring.

Life Centers has been committed to serving Hendricks County for over 10 years. Over that time, we have moved our center for various reasons. 

She created the Psalm 23 House as a "Christian residential home for single or pregnant single women to enhance themselves and their children in a comfortable environment." The Psalm 23 House provides them with shelter, food, clothing and transportation. There, women learn self-respect, healthy living, independence and most importantly about Christ and Christian virtues. Beyond



that, residents are mentored in life skills such as nutrition, prenatal and postnatal care, financial management, career planning, and much more.

The vision statement says: "The Psalm 23 House exists for single/pregnant women over the age of 18 who have been counseled at Life Centers, a church or a like-minded organization. We are excited to have this resource and have sent many young women to The Psalm 23 House.
